Program Overview:

The Early Childhood Multi-Cultural Education (ECME) Program will offer students an opportunity to begin the pathway to a variety of career possibilities. Students will be introduced to child development theories and their applications. The students will also be made aware of and familiarized with state requirements for licensing for in-home child care. Career opportunities for people involved in the field of early childhood education will also be presented to the students. The courses offered through this program will articulate into the certificate, Associate of Arts Degree, and Bachelor of Science Degree in Early Childhood Education, all of which can be completed at the University of New Mexico Gallup Campus.
