a. UNM-Gallup WAR Dashboards: Fall 2019 - James Malm reported headcount is up 13% from last year and then turned the report over to Brittany Babycos. Brittany reported the changes in head count from fall 2018 and fall 2019 as shown below. A total increase of student headcount of 318 for a total of 2498 UNMG students. Enrollment for UNM Gallup is up 4%.

We are at 23% of revenue compared to budget and we are at 17% through the year. Expenses are at 12% for the year. We are in good financial standing, at this time.

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AGENDA ITEM III – Public Comment Related to Items on the Agenda (limit 3 min per speaker) John Zimmerman spoke regarding the Union. Earlier this month the full-time faculty and part-time faculty from main campus and all the branches voted to have one union with two bargaining groups. With a stable administration, which has not always been the case, faculty wanted something that was permanent and stable.

- A. Academic Affairs Dr. Malm
 - 1. 2019 Faculty Union Election Results: October 18, 2019 James Malm requested that Dean Primozic report the faculty vote in favor of the two UA-UNM bargaining units:
 - Adjunct faculty vote count 259 yes, 26 no, 3 invalidated
 - Continuing faculty vote count 500 yes, 304 no, 60 challenge

The question was asked about the 60 challenge votes - many faculty were not eligible to vote but wanted to show their support by voting.

- B. Business Operations Dr. Malm turned this portion of the Agenda over to Robert Griego.
 - 2. UNM-Gallup Campus Summary of Current and Plant Funds Report: 2020 Period 4 Robert Griego We are 33.33% through the year. We are 34% at this point in the year in the budget. We are on track for expenses.
 - 3. UNM Foundation Consolidated Investment Fund Endowment Program 9/30/2019 Endowment Activity Report Gallup Branch - July 1 total \$723,202.22 with the additional contribution of \$50,000 by Cibola Medical Foundation Nursing Scholarship less the spending distribution of scholarships the September 30 balance is \$765,404.96.
 - 4. UNM-Gallup Physical Plant Storage Facility Update: October 1, 2019 OAC Meeting Minutes regarding the finding of less rock on the property than was expected which has allowed us to add some of the original plans we wanted without adding to the cost of the building. April 10, 2020 is the scheduled end of the building for turnover.
 - 5. New Mexico Higher Education Department Capital Outlay Recommendations for FY21-UNMG CCTEI Building is on the list for \$6,000,000 for the GO Bonds.

- 6. UNM-Gallup 5-yr Capital Plan Update Provost: November 2019 We have #1 on the list the CCTEI Building #2 is faculty repair and renewal for the 2020 funding request. For the 2021 funding request is the Career Ed Building renovation after vacating to the CCTEI Building. In 2022 Facility Repair and Renewal for updating existing facilities for ADA and appropriate safe environment.
- UNM-Gallup Branch Campus Multi-Year Financial Planning Report Provost: November 2019

 Robert reported that this is the first year UNMG has been requested to give projections for the next 5 years.
- C. Student Success and Enrollment Management Dr. Malm requested Jayme McMahon to report on this portion of the Agenda.
 - 8. UNM-Gallup Weekly Activity Report Enrollment Dashboard Spring 2019 The dashboard is showing comparison to this time last year.

Management Discussion & Analysis

Fiscal Year 2020 -2021 Budget

This Budget was prepared using the following assumptions:

- 1) no increases in revenue and no decreases in expenses,
- 2) no use of institutional reserves for I&G,
- 3) no new money,
- 4) no increases in tuition & fees,
- 5) no millage increase,
- 6) and no change in enrollments.

State Appropriations will fluctuate in the legislative process until House Bill #1 becomes law.

Any compensation increases will increase expenses and revenue at minimal net impact.

Five Year Capital Plan requires a 25% match from Institutional Reserves.

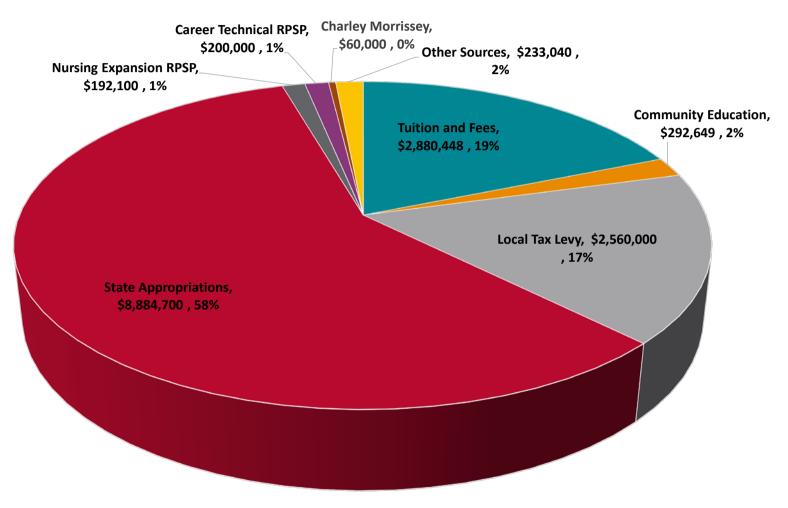

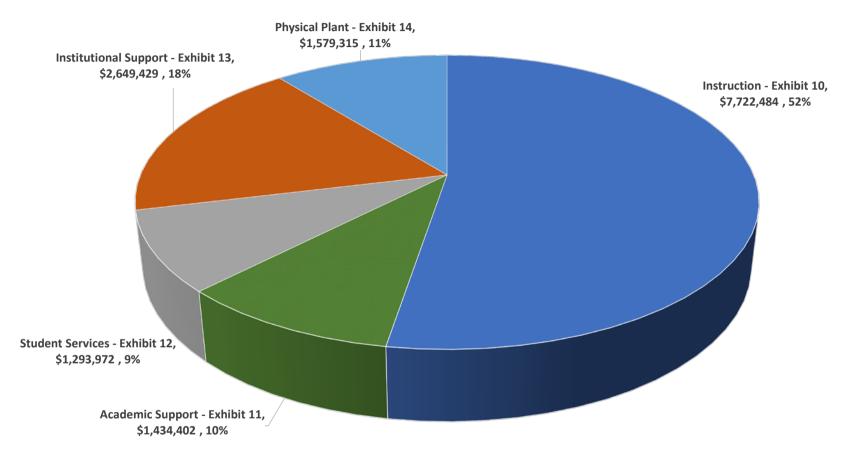


FY2020-2021 Instruction and General Sources of Revenue

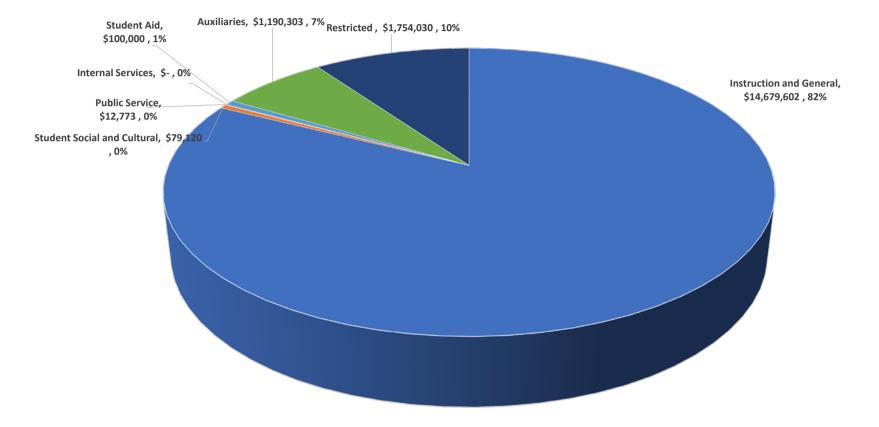




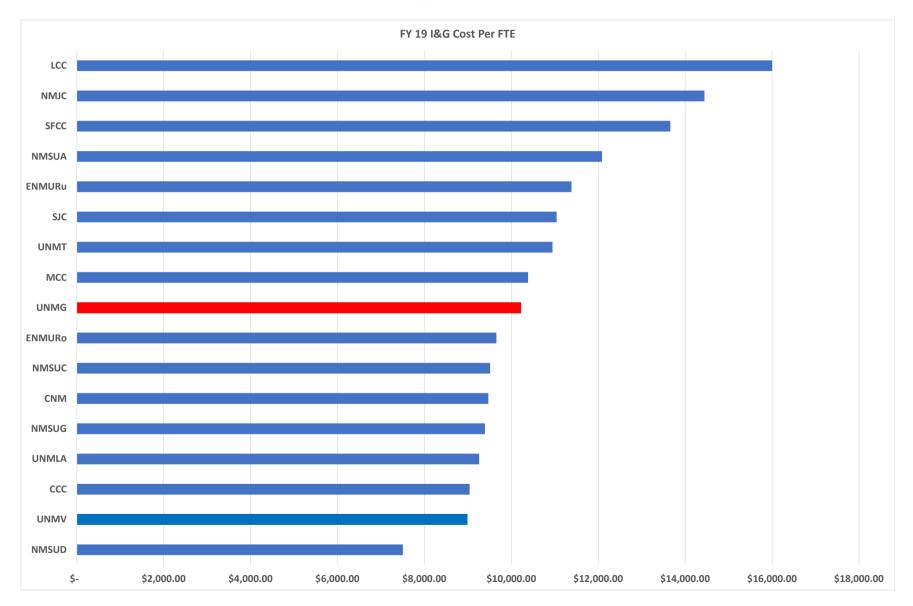
FY2020-2021 Instruction and General Expenditures



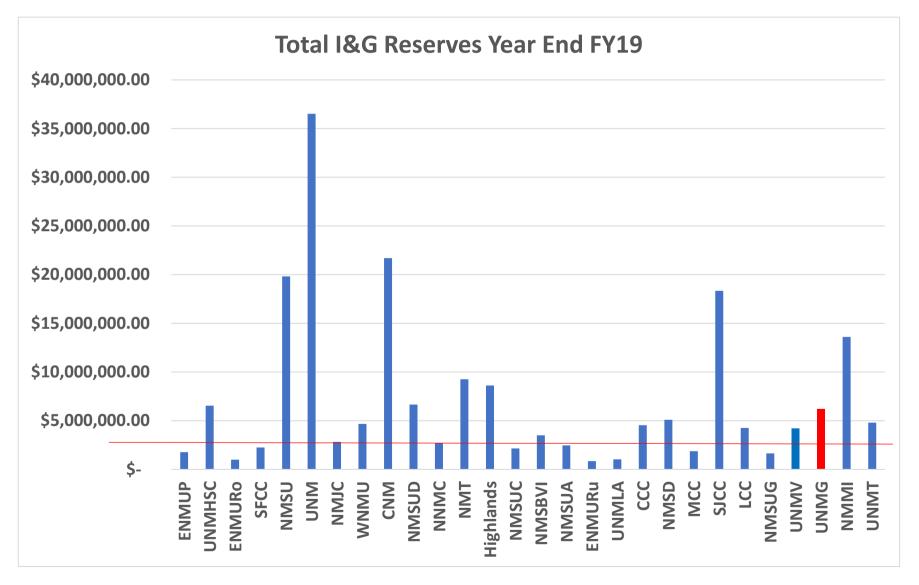




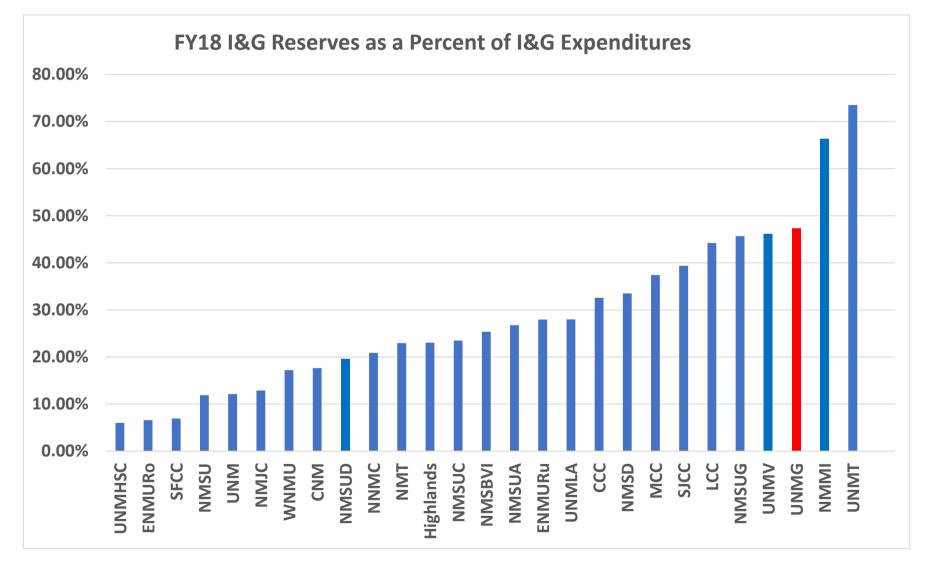














UNM releases 2020 Legislative Priorities

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The 2020 session of the NM Legislature begins soon and UNM has been hard at work identifying this year's legislative priorities. The state's abbreviated legislative sessions in even numbered years typically focus on state finances and a handful of policy initiatives.

When the 30-day session opens Jan. 21, legislators and the executive branch will be wrangling with how to best invest in New Mexico, while ensuring cash reserves are adequate. Gov. Michelle Lujan has indicated her priorities for the session include education, health care and infrastructure.

"UNM is grateful for the support we receive from the legislature and we are looking forward to the upcoming session," said UNM Chief Government Relations Officer Barbara Damron. "Our office has worked diligently with faculty, staff, students and leadership from across all of our campuses to evaluate our legislative needs and speak with a clear, unified voice to our legislators."

With an estimated \$800 million in new money available, New Mexico is again seeing increased general fund revenues from oil and gas activity. However, policymakers are familiar with this industry's volatility and the risk that it poses to recurring revenues. Both the Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) and the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) have submitted budget recommendations based on December revenue projections.

The following gives a brief glimpse of The University of New Mexico's 2020 legislative priorities.

Budaet

Funding Formula

 Since the funding formula's implementation eight years ago, UNM has exceeded the benchmarks established in the performance-based formula and strongly supports maintaining its current metrics. Institutions should be rewarded for efforts in improving outcomes for students. UNM supports the coordinated request for 8% new money in the funding formula made by the Council of University Presidents, Independent Community Colleges and the Association of Community Colleges.

• School of Medicine I&G

• The UNM School of Medicine is not part of the funding formula. We seek a percentage parity with the funding received by other institutions throughout the state.

• Compensation Formula Reform

• UNM supports the state's three higher education associations initiative to revise compensation calculation to include faculty and staff paid with tuition and fees.

• Compensation

• UNM supports the state's three higher education associations request for 5% compensation based on new compensation calculation. This request will reflect the hard work and dedication of our faculty and staff.

• NM Health Equity Scholarships

• \$6,000,000 to provide free Medical School tuition for students willing to commit to practicing in NM for four years post-residency.

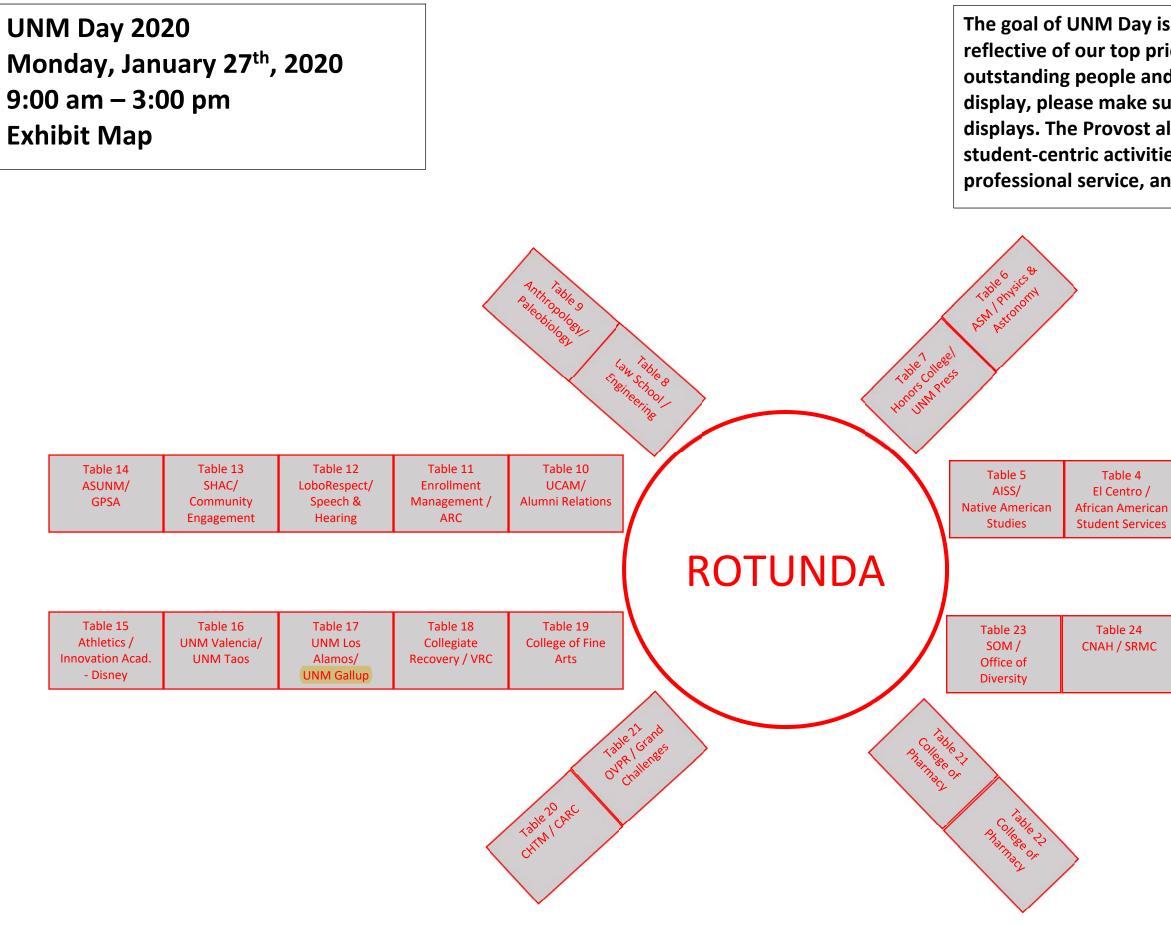
