Board members raised questions about previous efforts to increase bachelor-degree offerings at UNM-Gallup with discussion around this topic concluding with a summary of academic affairs committee efforts to innovate the curriculum and provide additional degree offerings in the future at UNM-Gallup.
- F. FY 2021-2022 UNM-Gallup Operating Budget: Robert Griego summarized the budget and answered board member questions regarding the budget. Chair Ralph Richards motioned to approve the 2021-2022 operating budget with a roll-call vote: Becky Apel (Aye); Ed Begay (Aye); Teri Garcia (Aye); Ralphy Richards (Aye).

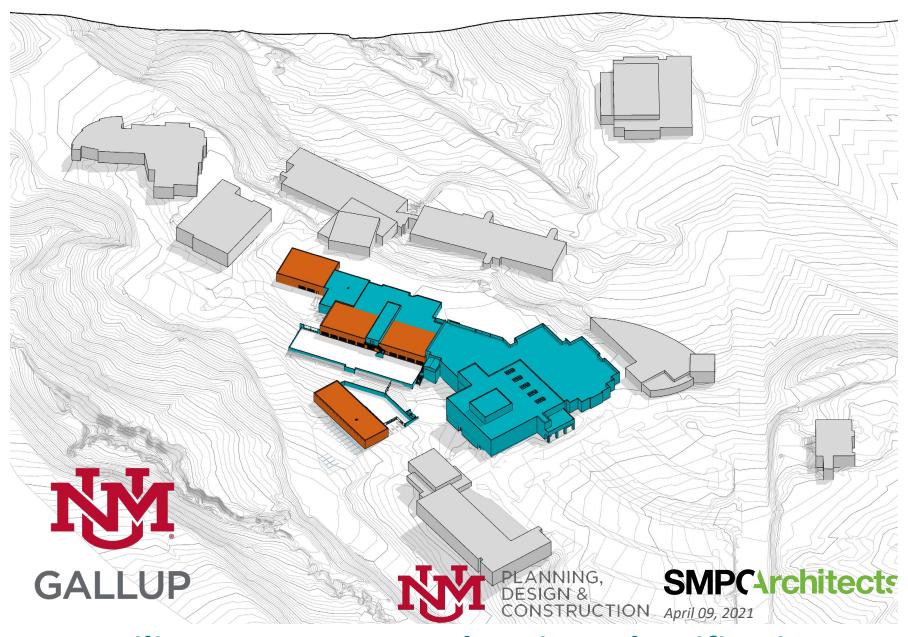

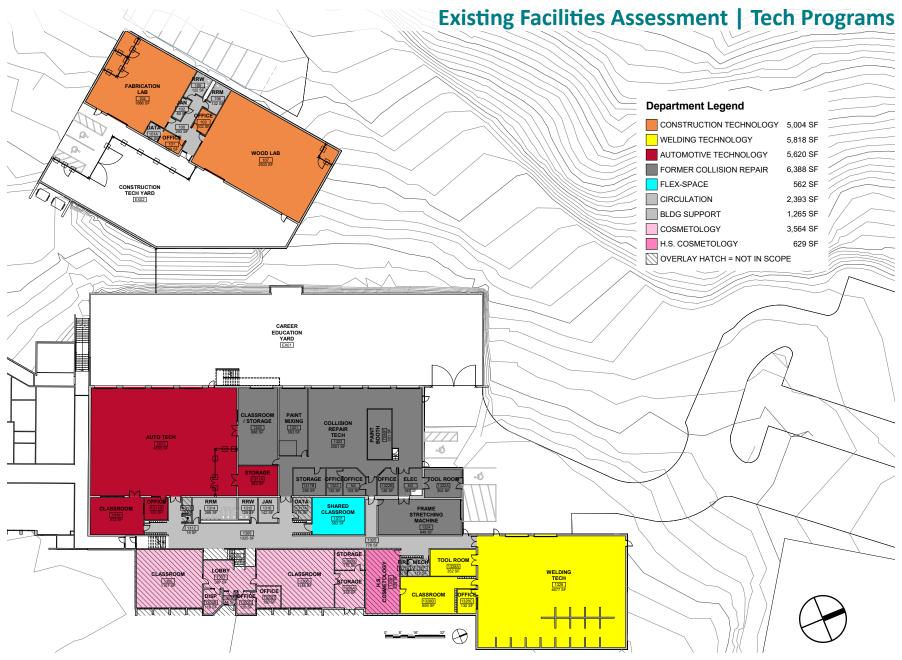


Diagram 01: CE + CT Buildings | Existing Floor Plan

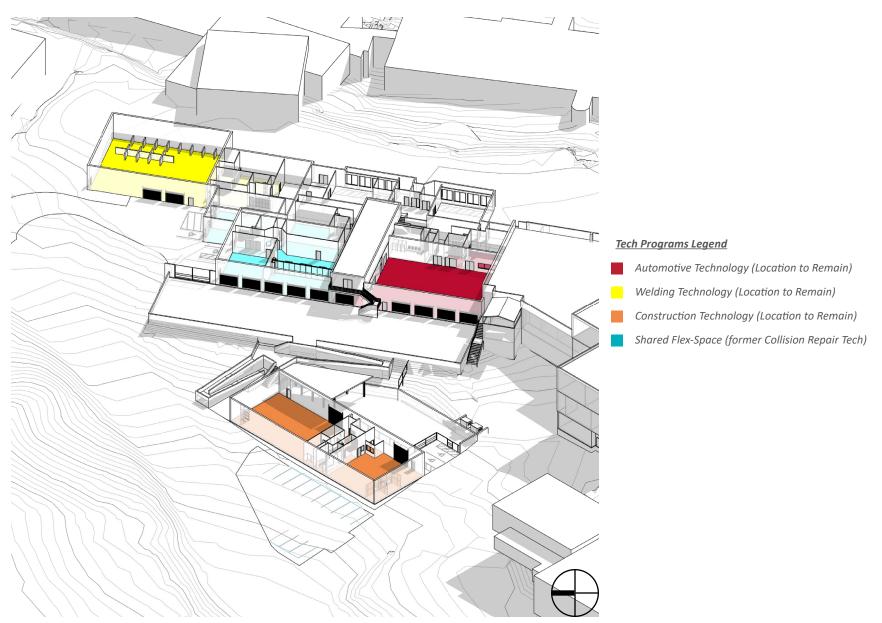


Diagram 02: Scenario 01 | CT + CE Buildings Isometric





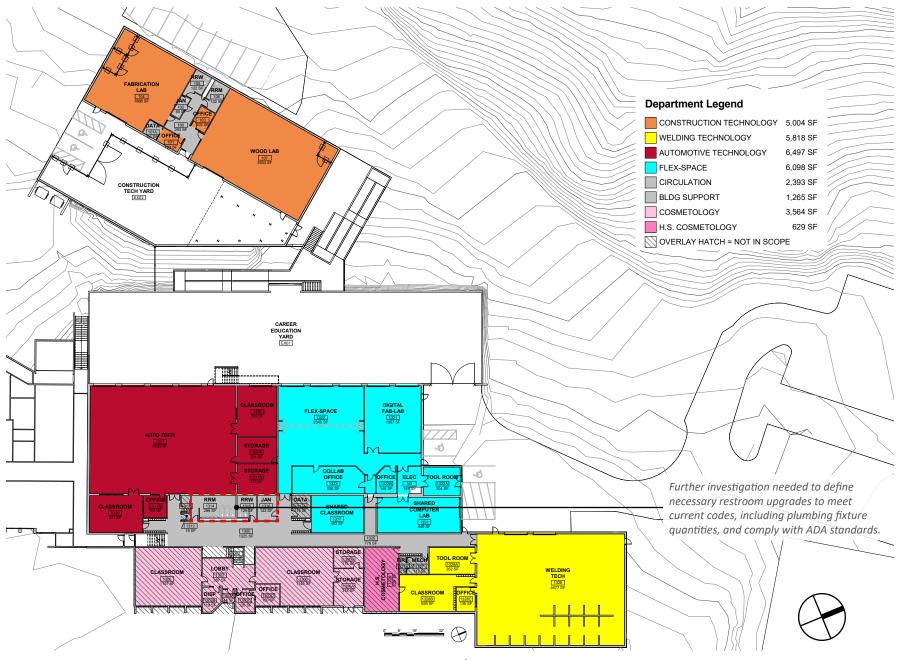


Diagram 03: Scenario 01 | Proposed Floor Plan







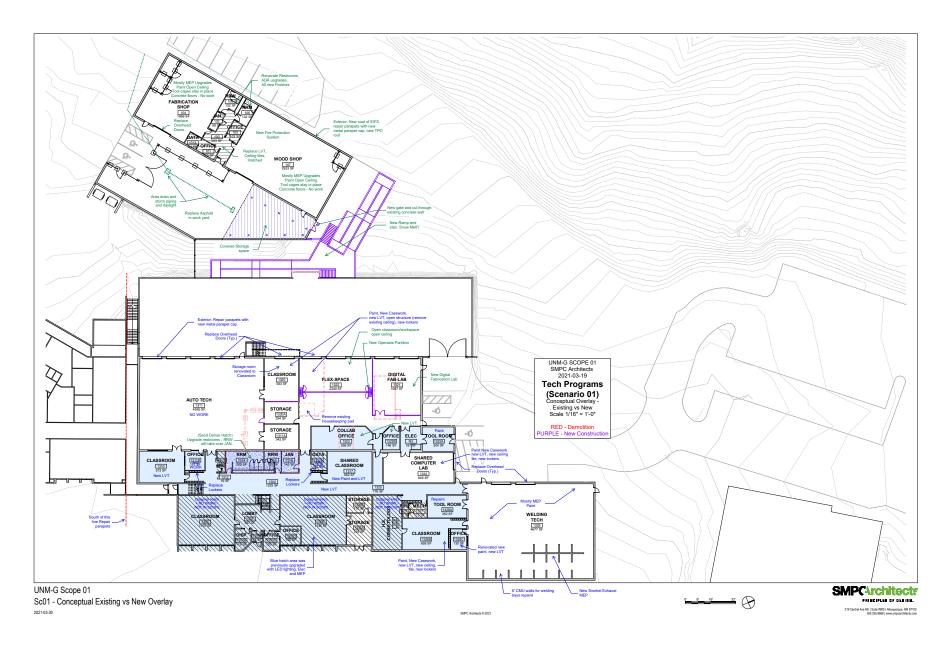
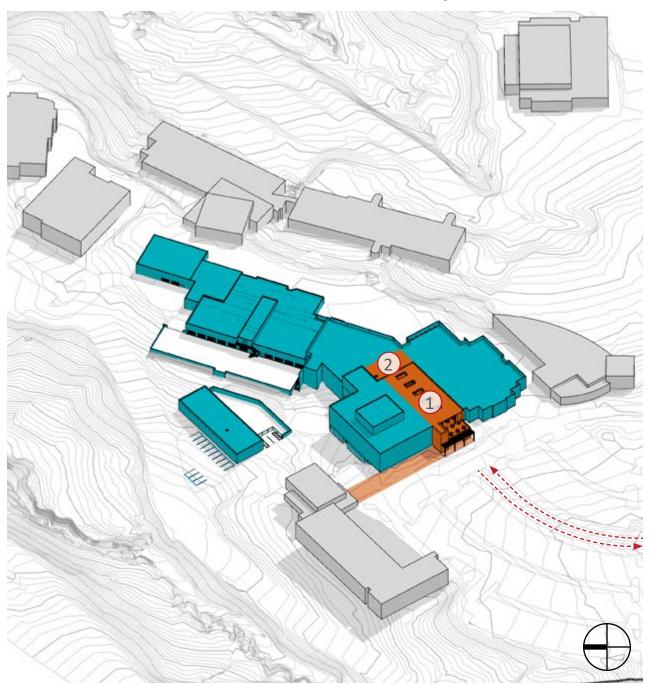


Diagram 04: Scenario 01 | Conceptual Overlay with Mark-Ups

# "Process Technology" Certificate Program offered at UNM-Gallup



## What is "Process Technology"?

- Process Technology (PTEC) is the term used to describe industrial or manufacturing processes that transform raw materials into higher value products.
- Process Industries are the manufacturing industries that transform raw materials into products used by consumers.
- Examples of Process Industries include: Water & Wastewater treatment, Food & Beverage manufacturing, Power Generation, Pharmaceuticals, Oil & Gas, Chemicals and Pulp & Paper.



# Rationale for a "PTEC" Program?

- The GGEDC provided the initial grant that brought me to UNM Gallup for program development.
- Marathon petroleum's Gallup refinery was the initial partner. That refinery closed last summer due to low demand during the pandemic.
- Other regional Industries include: Water & Wastewater treatment, Food & Beverage manufacturing, Power Generation and Distribution, Pharmaceuticals and Chemicals, along with Pulp & Paper and (hopefully) Oil & Gas.



## Where would a "PTEC" graduate work?

- UNM-Gallup has collaborated with local Industries that include: Water & Wastewater treatment, Food & Beverage manufacturing, Power Generation and Distribution, Pharmaceuticals, Chemicals, Oil & Gas, and Pulp & Paper.
- Examples include the City of Gallup (Utility & Energy)
   Departments), NTUA (Water & Energy), Rhino Health (Medical Equipment), McKinley Paper (Recycled Packaging), along with Marathon Petroleum (Oil & Gas).

# What is the budget projection and projected faculty need to support the new "PTEC" program?

- Projection is for 1.5 2 FTE to support the students in the program.
- If 1 FTE (fully loaded) costs \$120,000, and a second part time or "adjunct" instructor could be found for 50% 75% of FTE, then the budget impact could be estimated to be ~ \$ 200,000 per year.

Re: Staff Mass Salary Update Guidelines for FY22

To assist departments in preparing their annual operating budgets, UNM administration is releasing the following guidelines for staff compensation increases for Fiscal Year 2021-22:

#### **Mass Salary Update:**

Consistent with the salary increase approved by the UNM Board of Regents, departments should plan for a 1.5% salary increase for regular staff employees meeting the criteria below:

- Employees must have been hired prior to January 1, 2021 and have completed their probationary period prior to July 1, 2021.
- Employees must have obtained "Successful" overall ratings for both job responsibilities and goals on their annual 2020 Performance Evaluation.
- Salary increases for bargaining unit employees are subject to the applicable collective bargaining unit agreement.

Questions regarding Faculty increases should be directed to the Office of Faculty Affairs and Services (Faculty@unm.edu) or the HSC Faculty Contracts Office (HSC-HSCFCO@salud.unm.edu).

#### **Additional Salary Increase Requests:**

On a limited basis, departments will be permitted to request salary increases between 1.6% and 3% and will be allowed for equity, exceptional performance, and to support retention efforts, contingent on available department funding. The specific processes, guidelines, and approvals will be established by the appropriate President/EVP/SrVP and will be posted on <a href="https://example.com/hr/s/hg/srv/">HR's Mass Salary Update website</a> once available.

In addition, requests for increases between 3.1% and 5% will be considered as Out-of-Guidelines Exceptions. Exceptions should be <u>rare and are strictly reserved for exceptional circumstances</u>, contingent on available department funding and direct approval by the President/EVP/SrVP. The specific request processes and guidelines will be established by the appropriate President/EVP/SrVP and will be posted on <u>HR's Mass Salary Update website</u> once available.

Increases greater than 5% will not be allowed.

Subject: FY22 Mass Salary Update and Out of Guidelines Requests for Faculty and Staff

The UNM Board of Regents has approved a 1.5% Mass Salary Update (MSU), as well as MSU exceptions for merit and/or equity increases, contingent on available funding. All Academic Affairs' units must enter their respective requests that exceed the 1.5% through the appropriate form. To request an increase above 1.5%, departments should complete the online MSU Request Form <a href="https://hr.unm.edu/AA-MSU">https://hr.unm.edu/AA-MSU</a>. Exception request forms must be submitted no later than May 7, 2021.

Not all employees are eligible yet for the 1.5% increase. Please note the following criteria for individuals who are ineligible for the 1.5% increase and review HR's MSU Guidelines <a href="https://hr.unm.edu/mass-salary-update/">https://hr.unm.edu/mass-salary-update/</a> for additional information. Employees are ineligible if they:

- were hired or rehired on or after January 1, 2021
- were on probation as of June 30, 2020 (staff only)
- received an unsuccessful rating on their CY2020 performance evaluation
- are temporary employees (staff only)
- are members of a staff or faculty bargaining unit

Members of staff and faculty bargaining units will be eligible for increases negotiated with the respective unions.

The following guidelines are in place for all Academic Affairs' units for increases above 1.5% and up to 5%.

- 1. Increases in the range of 1.5% to 3% will be allowed (contingent on available funding within the unit) on a limited basis in recognition of concerns regarding internal equity, exceptional performance, to support retention efforts, or other unusual circumstances. Supporting documentation must be retained at the requesting department level. These requests will be reviewed by the Provost Office to validate the requests meet these guidelines and criteria.
- 2. Increases in the range 3% to 5% will be considered, but these should be <u>rare and will be strictly</u> <u>reserved for exceptional cases</u>. These requests should also meet at least one of the criteria outlined below and are contingent on available funding. These requests will be reviewed by the Provost's Office to validate the requests meet these guidelines and criteria and must be approved by the Provost.



- a. **Meritorious Performance**: What significant accomplishments or outcomes influence this pay action?
- b. **Equity/Market/Midpoint**: How does the employee's (faculty or staff) salary compare with similarly situated employees within the unit those who have similar levels of training and experience? In cases of internal equity caused by a new hire the requestor must provide the name of newly hired employee, date of hire, and hiring salary.
- 3. Increases above 5% will not be part of the MSU process. Please utilize existing HR practices and policies for staff. Supervisors should consult with HR for guidance regarding staff and the Senior Vice Provost for faculty.

Given the limited time to enter these increases in Salary Planner, we recommend that the 1.5% increase for eligible employees is entered in accordance with the Provost Guidelines, but increases above the 1.5% should be budgeted in a holding account (account code 20SA, with a comment indicating the details of the increases).

Please note compensation request forms for faculty increases will not be used for this purpose.
