

1. Description of the project:

I would like to invite a visiting slam poet to the UNM-Gallup campus for a one day event. He or she would visit with my ENGL 220 Creative Writing class to discuss the craft of slam poetry. I would extend an invitation for other classes to attend this workshop. I would also ask our visiting poet to perform a public reading on-campus for all faculty, staff, and students.

2. Rationale for how the project will benefit the faculty, staff, students, UNM-G, or the communities at large:

This event will promote the importance of literacy for all faculty, staff, and students of UNM-Gallup. It will also be an enrich event for community members especially our high school students (Middle College HS and other Gallup high schools). Slam poetry is a very popular literary genre because it combines the power of poetic language, performance, and social interaction. Slam poetry often focuses on political and cultural issues including ethnicity, gender, and socioeconomic issues. For example, slam poets tackle subjects that would resonate with our campus community—growing up poor, racism, sexual identity issues, addiction, etc. Slam poetry is not academic; it is not poetry that lives only on the page, but poetry that engages everyone in a communal, social event. Slam poetry offers students a sense of empowerment by offering a space for their voices

3. Expected outcomes or products of this project:

The expected outcomes would be the following. UNM-G students would have the opportunity to explore their own lives and express their experiences through the genre of slam poetry. If this event is funded, UNM-G students, faculty, and staff may feel inspired to present their own poetry slam here at UNM-G campus.

4. Describe the timeline for the project, resources needed, and the person responsible for each action step.

When: Once the funding is awarded I would schedule this event either in October or November of fall semester 2015.

Action Step: I will contact various slam poets in the New Mexico area and make a decision regarding who will be our visiting slam poet. I have already been in communication with one slam poet—a young Chicano poet from Albuquerque who is very interested.

Resources Needed: Money is needed to fund this event. We would need to pay the poet's fee for presenting a workshop and for performing, along with his or her traveling expenses and meals.
