WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW?

- Admission is competitive
- Our program admits up to 16 Associate Degree seeking students each semester
- You must complete the 5 pre-requisite courses before you can apply: ENGL 1110 Composition I, PSYC 1110 Intro to Psychology, BIOL 1310 and BIOL1310L Anatomy & Physiology I/Lab, CHEM 1120C Intro to Chemistry for Non-Majors, HCHS123 Human Growth and Development
- You must register, take, and pass the ATI TEAS entrance exam before you can apply
- We use a point-based Selection Tool to select our students

ADMISSION

ADMISSION IN COMPETITIVE

- We do not admit or have classes in the summer
- The students that have the higher test scores and higher GPA (pre-requisite cumulative and pre-requisite science) are at the top of the list

PRE-REQUISITE COURSES

- Students must complete the following pre-requisites before they apply to the program.
 - ENGL 1110: Accelerated Composition
 - PSYC 1110: General Psychology
 - BIOL 1310: Anatomy & Physiology I
 - BIOL 1310L: Anatomy & Physiology I Lab
 - CHEM 1120C: Elements of General Chemistry
 - HCHS 123: Human Growth & Development
 - MATH 1215: Intermediate Algebra or MATH 1220 College Algebra
- The pre-requisite GPA must be at least a 2.75
- All pre-requisite courses must be passed with a 'C' or better
- Courses may be completed at another institution but must transfer to UNM. Course transfers to UNM-Gallup from other colleges must be done one semester prior to applying to the program, so submit it in a timely manner.



ENTRANCE EXAM

- UNM-Gallup Nursing Program uses the ATI TEAS
- The ATI TEAS tests:
 - Reading
 - Science
 - Math
 - English and Language Usage
- The minimum passing score is:
 - Reading: $\geq 69\%$
 - Science: $\geq 52\%$
 - Composite/Total: $\geq 58.7\%$
- UNM-Gallup administers the ATI TEAS each semester (Fall, Summer) for students applying to our program. Students who are ready to apply to the program for the following semester may take it at UNM-G. Students are cleared to test by the Student Success Specialist.



SELECTION TOOL

- UNM-G Nursing Program uses a point system to select up to 16 Associate Degree seeking students
- 100 application points possible
- The closer you get to 100 points, the higher chance you have at getting in
 - Be a point monster!
- The higher your test score and pre-requisite grades, the more points you get
- There are 4 sections that you earn points in:
 - ATI TEAS score
 - Pre-requisite cumulative GPA
 - Pre-requisite science GPA
 - Completion of additional courses before you apply

SECTION I: ENTRANCE EXAM- 50 POINTS POSSIBLE

- The ATITEAS test accounts for half of the application points- 50 points possible
- **NOTE:** You must meet the minimum score in 3 areas: Reading, Science, and Composite.
- Based on your scores, you can get 30, 40, or 50 points.

SECTION 2: PRE-REQUISITE CUMULATIVE GPA- 20 POINTS POSSIBLE

- This section accounts for 20 possible application points
- The GPA for the grades you earned in Engl 1110, Psyc 1110, Biol 1310, Biol 1310L, Chem 1120C, and HCHS 123 will be calculated
- The higher your pre-requisite cumulative GPA, the more points you get in this section

SECTION 3: PRE-REQUISITE SCIENCE GPA- 20 POINTS POSSIBLE

- This section accounts for 20 possible application points
- The GPA for the grades you earned in BIOL 1310, BIO1310L, and CHEM 1120C will be calculated
- The higher your pre-requisite science GPA, the more points you get in this section

SECTION 4: COMPLETION OF SELECTED COURSES- 10 POINTS POSSIBLE

- This section accounts for 10 possible application points
- Each completed course with a 'C' or better will give you 2.5 points
- There are 4 courses you may take before applying:
 - ENGL 1120: Composition III
 - BIOL 1320: Anatomy & Physiology 2
 - NURS 239: Pathophysiology I
 - NURS 240: Pathophysiology II
- You will have to take these courses to complete the Associates in Nursing Degree program, but you can take them after you are admitted.
- These courses are NOT pre-requisite courses!



FINAL SELECTION OF NURSING STUDENTS

TOTAL POINTS EARNED

- We will add the points you earned in each section
- Your total points will be at the bottom of the selection sheet
- You will be ranked according to your points earned
- The higher your points, the higher you will get on our selection list
- We will take the students with the most points
- 2 alternates will be selected and will be offered a slot if a selected student declines their offer of admission
- Once you are admitted to our program, your UNM student status will change to 'Associates of Applied Science in Nursing'. Currently, many of you are listed as 'Associates of Science'. Only selected and enrolled students in our nursing program are designated as 'Associates of Applied Science in Nursing' students.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

- What if I took my pre-requisites at another school?
 - Schedule an appointment with the Student Success Specialist to have an informal credit evaluation done. However, it is strongly recommended that you apply and submit official transcripts to UNM so an official ruling is made. We welcome students from all schools to apply to our nursing program.
- I took BIOL 2210/2210L (BIOL237/227L) instead of BIOL 1310/1310L. Can I still apply?
 - Yes.
- How can I figure out my pre-req GPA?
 - UNM offers a great online GPA calculator. It can be found at: <https://students.unm.edu/lobo-learning-hacks/index.html>
- What can I do if my pre-req GPA is not high enough?
 - Students have the option to re-take a course. We will accept the higher grade to factor into your pre-requisite GPA.
- I took PSY220 (Developmental Psychology) instead of HCHS123. Do I still have to take HCHS123?
 - No. We will accept PSY220 as a substitute for HCHS123. However, we prefer students take HCHS123.
- Do I need CNA experience before I can apply?
 - No. Having CNA experience is not a pre-requisite.
- I passed the test and met the pre-req GPA. How do I apply?
 - If a student passes the ATI TEAS, an application to apply to the program will be emailed to that student with an invitation to apply to the Associate Degree program.
- If I do not get in, can I reapply? And, do I have to take the ATI TEAS test again?
 - Yes, we encourage students to reapply if they did not get in. ATI TEAS scores are good for 1 year. If you reapply within that 1 year, you do not have to re-take the ATI TEAS. You can re-apply with your previous scores.
- What can I do to prepare for the ATI TEAS?
 - We encourage students to use ATI TEAS study books. You can purchase these in our UNM-G bookstore or with an online vendor.
