Brandon Lewis was born and raised in Gallup, New Mexico. After graduating high school he joined the Marine Corps, where he served for 8 years. When he returned he worked for the BNSF railroad for 12 years and he eventually decided to go back to school.

Brandon went back to school at UNM Gallup. He went on to graduate with his AA in Automotive Technology in 2020. After which he joined the Oils Program with UNM Main Campus and completed this Fall 2022 with his Bachelor's Degree. Brandon joined TRIO/SSS around 2018. He encourages students to continue their educational careers and to think beyond what is currently holding you back.






Martin Luther King Jr.

Martin Luther King Jr. was born January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia. Both his grandfather and father served as pastors for the Ebenezer Baptist Church. This is where Martin would eventually co-pastor alongside his father.

Martin Luther King Jr. graduated from high school at fifteen years old. In 1948, he then earned his B. A. degree and B. D. degree in 1951. Eventually, he graduated with his Doctorate in 1955.

He then went on to become the pastor of Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in 1954 and was an executive member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People by this time. He also led a 382 day long boycott against laws requiring segregation on buses. King was then elected president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference in 1957. He went on to lead many peaceful and impactful civil rights protests.

He would travel to many places to speak on civil right issues. He would then go on to deliver his "I Have A Dream" speech in Washington D.C. King then went on to become the youngest man to receive the Noble Peace Prize at 35. King was without a doubt, a very accomplished man and a role model for those seeking justice.
