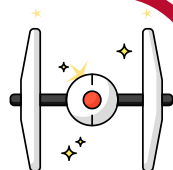

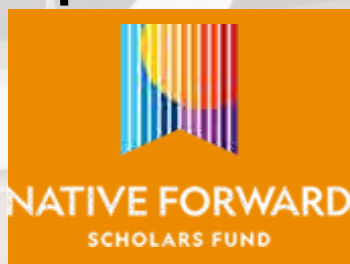

A full-time scholarship is worth \$5,000 per academic year (\$2,500 each semester)

In order to be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following pre-requisites:

- An enrolled tribal member of the Navajo Nation
- Minimum cumulative 2.8 GPA required
- Accepted to or currently attending an accredited college or university full-time (12 or more credits) unless enrolled in a trimester or quarterly college or university
- Must maintain a cumulative 2.8 GPA or higher each semester of college to retain the scholarship for the following semester

Deadline: June 7th, 2024 12:00PM MST



In order to be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following pre-requisites:

- Complete Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA)
- Provide a copy of most recent cumulative academic transcript
- Be a degree-seeking student attending a U.S. accredited institution recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education or the Council of Higher Education.
- Be an enrolled member or descendant of a U.S. federally recognized or state-recognized American Indian Tribe or Alaska Native group.

Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United States, observed on the last Monday of May, dedicated to mourning and honoring military personnel who lost their lives in service. This tradition originated after the Civil War, when people began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers. The inaugural large-scale national observance took place on May 30, 1868, at Arlington National Cemetery. It was officially recognized as a federal holiday in 1971.

Today, Memorial Day serves multiple purposes in American society:

Honoring Fallen Soldiers:

- Americans visit cemeteries and memorials to pay respects
- Flags are placed on graves of military personnel
- Moments of silence are observed at 3:00 PM local time (National Moment of Remembrance)
- The American flag is flown at half-staff until noon, then raised to full staff

Community Observances:

- Memorial Day parades featuring veterans, military units, and community organizations
- Memorial services and wreath-laying ceremonies at war memorials
- Patriotic music performances and speeches honoring the fallen
- Educational programs teaching younger generations about the holiday's significance

Cultural Traditions:

- Displaying the American flag prominently
- Wearing red poppies (inspired by the WWI poem "In Flanders Fields")
- Attending or hosting barbecues and family gatherings
- Participating in outdoor recreational activities

It's important to distinguish Memorial Day from Veterans Day (November 11), which honors all who served in the military, both living and deceased. Memorial Day specifically commemorates those who died in military service.



Here's a wonderful way to give back or commemorate this year: consider writing a thank-you letter to active-duty military members or the families of those who have fallen. Alternatively, you could donate to reputable charities that support veterans.



Since 2004, A Million Thanks® has supported more than 21 million service members and veterans through messages that strengthen morale, connection, and emotional well-being. These letters have become a nationwide movement of gratitude, resilience, and hope.

Do you have any study habits you would recommend to other students? What are they?

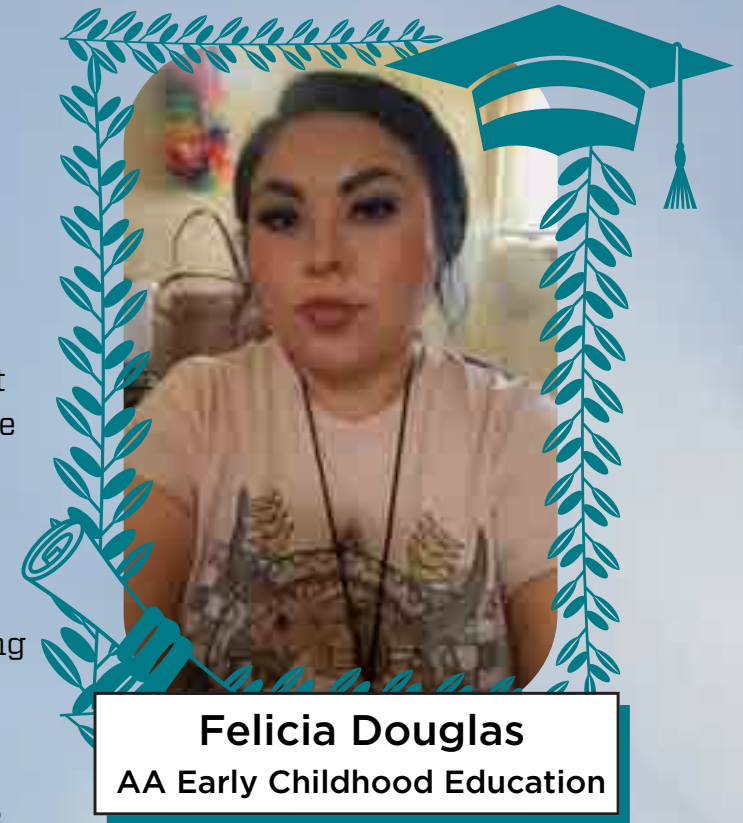
"I like to listen to music to help me relax and shut the music completely off, and I like to sit in silence while I complete my homework."
