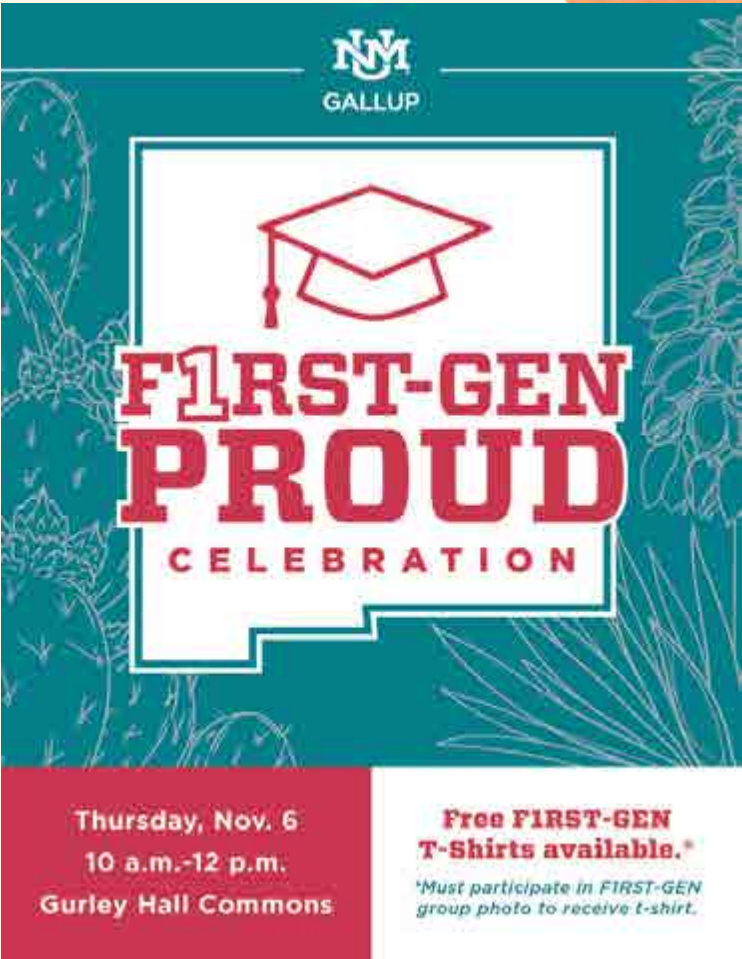

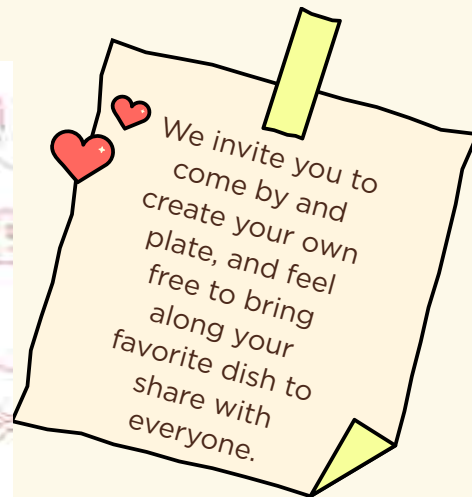

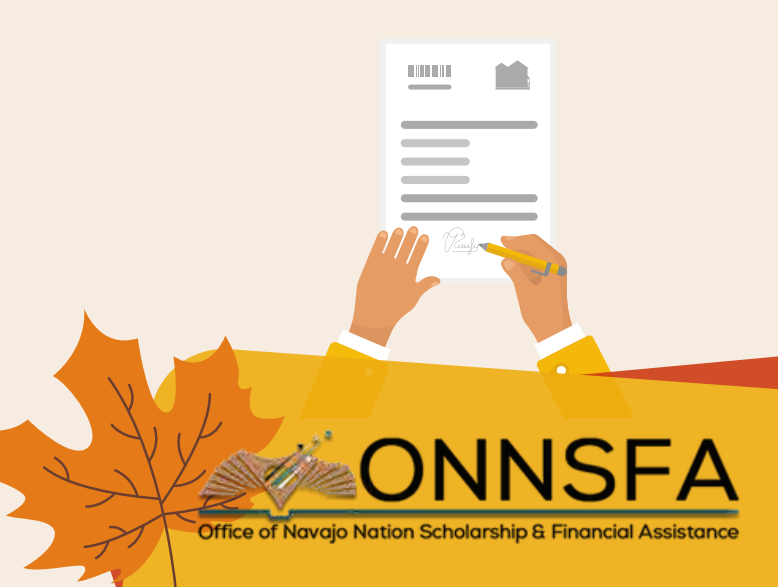

NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH



This month is dedicated to honoring the rich diversity of cultures, languages, and histories within Native American communities. It seeks to foster awareness and understanding of the challenges that Native peoples encounter.

There are 574 federally recognized tribal governments in the United States. The largest groups are the Navajo (Dineh), Cherokee, Sioux (Lakota), Chippewa (Ojibwa), Choctaw, Apache, Lumbee, Creek, Pueblo, Iroquois, Blackfeet, and Chickasaw.
