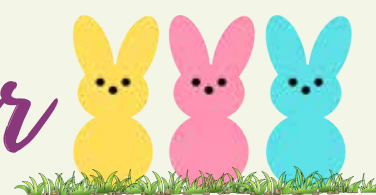


April Newsletter

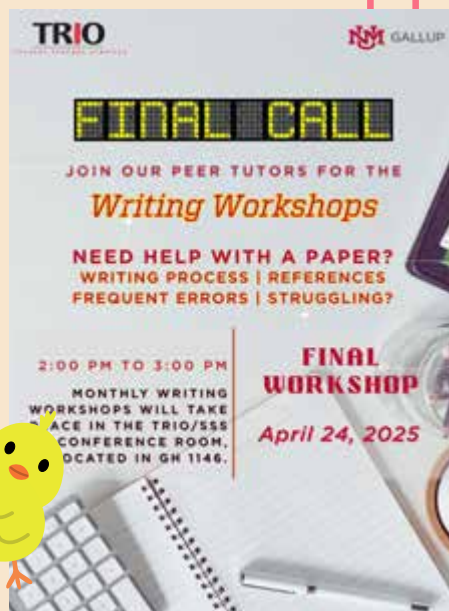
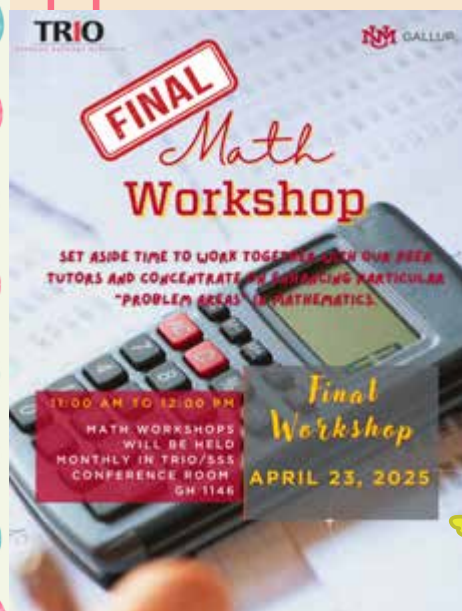

NTUA SCHOLARSHIP

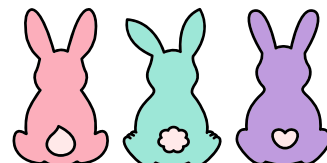

The mission of the Southwest Native American Foundation is to provide the students of Native American tribes in the Southwestern U.S. with the opportunity of higher education by offering scholarships to outstanding high school students and enrolled university students. We believe that everyone—regardless of their background or financial situation—should have this opportunity.

THE AMERICAN INDIAN AND SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING



The American Indian and Science and Engineering Society offers scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000 per year, supporting Indigenous students pursuing degrees in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) fields at undergraduate and graduate levels. Applications must be submitted by April 30.

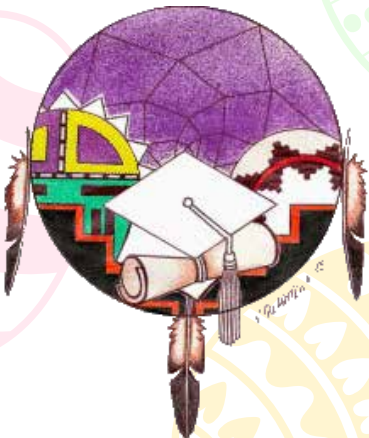
NATIONAL MEDICAL FELLOWSHIP

CATCHING THE DREAM



They recognize and reward outstanding student achievement. This supplemental award is intended to help Native American Indian students who are $\frac{1}{4}$ or more degree American Indian, and an enrolled member of a U.S. tribe. "U.S. Tribe" is defined as federally recognized, state recognized or terminated. All awards are based on merit, academic achievement and ambition. Students must attend a college or university on a fulltime basis, seeking a BA or higher.



Navajo Sovereignty Day



The Navajo Nation was granted sovereignty in 1868 through a treaty with the United States government, which recognized them as an independent nation. This territory spans over 27,000 square miles across northeastern Arizona, southwestern Utah, and northwestern New Mexico. The 1868 treaty was signed four years after members of the Navajo tribe were forcibly removed from their lands in Arizona in 1864 and made to march to New Mexico under duress.

Initially, April 16 was designated as the day of celebration for their sovereignty in 1985; however, it is now observed on the fourth Monday in April. On this day, all schools and administrative offices close to honor the Navajo Nation and its people. This recognition stems from a 1985 Supreme Court ruling that affirmed the Navajo Nation's right to impose taxes without requiring approval from the U.S. government, distinguishing these taxes as separate from state and federal taxes. This ruling significantly contributed to the reinforcement of the Nation's independence.

About the Artwork

The Navajo Basket has many stories behind it. I believe our people's emergence is an important story shared when creating a traditional woven Navajo basket. I used copper for the backing and soldered the holders in place. I used nickel silver for the front which is held to the backing using a cold connection known as riveting. I also sand-blasted the basket outline onto the copper backing for a more visual appeal.
