- Be an enrolled member of a federally or state-recognized tribe, or a descendent of an enrolled member.
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00.
- Full-time enrollment at an accredited, nonprofit institution of higher learning.

This application is for the Fall 2025-Spring 2026 academic year and is intended for students seeking or completing an undergraduate or associate degree.

Deadline: June 13th, 2025 11:59PM MST

To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following pre-requisites:

- Must be an enrolled Navajo tribal member
- Required 3.0 GPA
- Must be enrolled part-time or full-time at an accredited college or university, pursuing an undergraduate or associate degree
- Must submit one introduction essay and answer two essay prompts.
- Must maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher each semester to retain the scholarship



MEMORIAL DAY IN THE UNITED STATES

What distinguishes Memorial Day from Veterans Day?

Both holidays pay tribute to individuals who have served in the United States military.

- **Memorial Day** is specifically dedicated to commemorating those who lost their lives in service during wartime.
- **Veterans Day** honors all individuals who have served in the military, regardless of their active-duty status.

Traditions:

- Visiting cemeteries and military memorials
- Placing flags on veterans graves
- Participating in local parades and ceremonies
- Flying the American flag at half-staff

For decades, Memorial Day continued to be observed on May 30, the date General Logan had selected for the first Decoration Day. But in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees. The change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday.



NATIONAL MURDERED MISSING INDIGENOUS PEOPLE DAY

The red hand symbolizes the connection between the physical world and the spiritual world. Native Americans believe that the dead can see red, so by wearing red we invoke the help of our ancestors and spiritual guides.



IDEAS ON HOW TO PARTICIPATE AND RAISE AWARENESS:

- 1) Wear RED on May 5th and post a photo on social media with the hashtag #NationalDayofAwareness #MMNWG or #MMIW
- 2) Host a community event in your community on May 5th
- 3) Host a prayer circle or candlelight vigil on May 5th
- 4) Post a list of names of sisters missing or murdered from your community,
- 5) Create a living memorial
- 6) View the National Indigenous Women's Resource Center webinars.

May 5th marks the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, observed throughout the United States and Canada.

A meaningful way to support the MMIW movement includes raising awareness by sharing relevant stories and videos, offering support to victims, and reflecting on any personal biases or judgments.

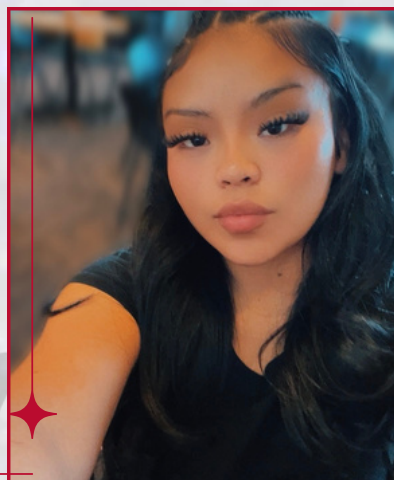

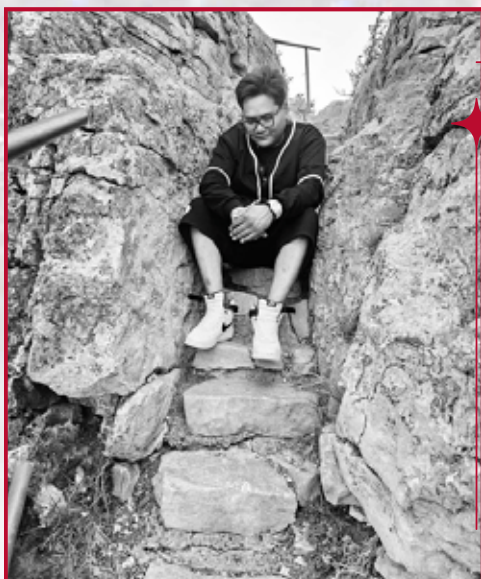
