I remain hopeful that our elected officials in Congress will pass some semblance of President Biden's American Families Plan that includes \$109 billion for two years of free community college so that “every student has the ability to obtain a degree or certificate” [as declared recently by the president who also stated](#) that our workers “need and deserve additional support to build their skills, increase their earnings, remain competitive, and share in the benefits of the new economy.”

I echo these sentiments and believe that our students are so deserving of increased access to higher education, employment opportunities, and ultimately a prosperous life. That is why I am so excited to be a part of the NMACC's work to ensure the ongoing sustainability and excellence of our state's higher education system.

Please enjoy this upcoming July 4th holiday weekend joyfully and safely with your family and friends as we celebrate our great nation. And remember that campus will be closed on Monday, July 5th.
