Last year we ended up in the black; that is the goal for this year as well. We want to have meetings now so we have time to work on it. Frank Anankoah commended Tim and his team for getting math lab running.

DISCUSSION

1. It is an institutional requirement that we address issues of sexual assault on campus. This includes both Title IX and Cleary Reporting. If we are not compliant with them, we could be fined.
2. Update related to advisement: main campus has decentralized advisement. Advisement is done by advisors or achievement coaches who are located in specific schools or departments. We can talk about this more to have an advisor specific to a school. We have a small team to look at new and/or first term students.
3. Student Services are planning on fieldtrips to main campus. These are not just for students; they are also for staff and faculty. The fieldtrips include tours different presentations. These will most likely be scheduled on Fridays.
4. TRIO and Student Life have traded spaces. The idea behind it is that we want to expand Student Life presence. They are getting artwork and making it a student-friendly environment. They want to invite some of the main campus organizations to come out as well. LGBT will have a representative there. Health Services will have computers so that they can reach students on our campus for counseling and advice. They are interested in getting several other services represented so we give services like at main campus.
5. One of the pipelines of enrollment is the dual enrollment program. Frank & Ann and a few others are on the committee for this. They are working to assess our program, compare it with other programs, make a hand book, and talk to divisions.
6. Clubs – we have some students who want to get some student clubs going. Student Senate is not running after what happened in spring. But working on getting it going again with rules and guidance. Then that will go to students to vote.
7. Outreach initiatives: College Days will take information out to communities about our school. They will send out calendar; if anyone is interested in being involved let them know.
8. Questions:
 - a. Matt Mingus has there been feedback from main campus on the financial drop change?
 - i. Student Services have given main campus their comments but also have to comply with the decisions that are made at main campus.
 - b. L.D. Lovett is there a problem with Cleary, or is this just preventative action on our part?
 - i. Jeannie Baca – it is a little of both
 - c. Frank Amankoah what is student enrollment this term?
 - i. Jeannie Baca: Enrollment is down. UNM Valencia & UNM LA are up, but we are not. We need to let people know we exist, working with high school counselors, veteran's groups, etc. We are all ambassadors for our programs – not just one or two classes, but for the entire programs. The dual enrollment program is very good because parents not paying.
 - d. Tom – How many ARC students do we have?
 - i. Jeannie Baca: About 120. We seem to have a high number, but that is okay. Students need to be aware of the programs. We appreciate what you do to work with our students. Our accommodation faculty has been praised by the ARC students.
 - e. Jim Sayers – What about retention?
 - i. Jeannie Baca: Related to retention – we are looking at all of our majors and the number of credits they have. We will be working with our advisors to work with students more closely. If there are students who need intervention, faculty should contact her office.
 - f. Jim Sayers– Could we get numbers on those?
 - i. Jeannie Baca: Absolutely. We can get with Marie to look at success rates for different classes
 - g. John Zimmerman – are students given a copy of the handbook when they enroll? They need to be aware of the processes for complaints, etc. that are in place.
 - i. Jeannie Baca: As of now, no, but we are revising the orientation process and then they will. Yes, the students need to know.
 - ii. Dean Ahmed: – policies are in place, but sometimes they are hard to reconcile. If a student has a problem he should talk to his instructor; then if the problem is not solved, he should go to Student Services or Dean. The Student Services or Dean will tell him to make an appointment with the faculty. But the Student Services & Dean need to be involved to help solve problem. The division chair should call the faculty. Problems should be followed up upon and not fall through the cracks.
 - h. Frank Amankonah – what percent of students are funded by financial aid?
 - i. Jeannie Baca: It is over 70%. I can send that information out as well.

In addition, I'd like to have faculty retreats. Perhaps we can have one in the spring. 2. Strategic plan we started with was dated in some ways, but we are revising it now. This is a partnership with the Children, Youth and Family Department. I hope that our school will be a pilot program to establish best practices that then can be replicated statewide.
